9 THE COURT: Ladies and gentlemen of
10 the jury, we are going to start up at 10:00
11 o'clock tomorrow morning with the punishment
12 stage of the trial. Now, during this period of
13 time you will remain sequestered until the end
14 of the trial, so I just wanted to let you know
15 that. We know you worked hard today, and we're
16 going to let you go home, or go back to the
17 motel and get some rest, and we'll start up
18 tomorrow morning at 10:00 o'clock. We hope you
19 have a nice evening. You're excused.

21 (The jury retired from the
22 courtroom.)

24 THE COURT: We will start at 10:00
25 tomorrow morning. The court will recess until

1 that time.
