

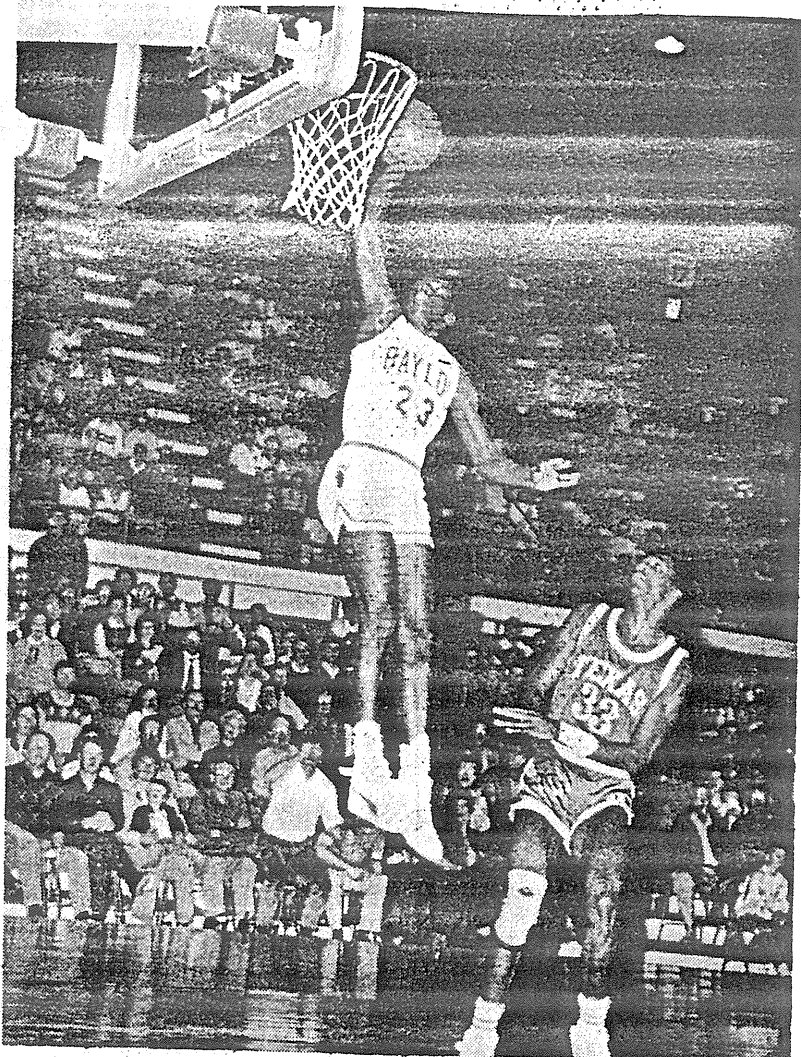

County Judge Raymond Matkin and commissioners approved the renting of office space from the City of Crawford for the Precinct 7 Justice of the Peace.

## S.E. Chastain Trial Moved

Wacoan S. E. Chastain was scheduled to begin his trial Monday in Pecos on charges of possession with intent to distribute over 50 kilos of cocaine before Western District Judge Luscious Bunton.

However the trial has been reset for Midland. No date was given for the new trial. No jury was called for the trial today in Pecos.

Chastain, J. G. Hazeltine and Gary J. Wood were arrested on October 24 and charged.

At the time of their arrest, the pickup in which, Chastain and Hazeltine were riding had over 706 pounds of cocaine in the bed. Also found in the truck were DA Vic Feazell campaign signs and petitions for the removal of City Manager David Smith and Waco Police Chief Larry Scott from their jobs.

## Feazell Hearing Rescheduled

A hearing scheduled in Judge James Nowlin's Western District Federal Court Thursday concerning District Attorney Vic Feazell has been changed to February 12.

Pre-trial motions filed in late November were to be heard. Other motions filed by attorneys Gary Richardson and Jeff Kearney in December are scheduled for hearing on January 28.

According to Austin Federal Court sources, Judge Nowlin will also set the new date for the trial on February 12. It was previously set to begin February 2.
