


Submitted to Don Ford, Chief

Tuesday, August 26, 1986, I left my office located at 706 Sun Valley Road and drove to my home approximately 2 miles down Spring Valley Road, passing within one block of the 505 Angle Fire residence. I had just entered by home when the pager announced the 505 Angle Fire address as a structure fire. Running to my truck, I could see the sky was already full of heavy black smoke as if a house was fully engulfed, as when the roofing material is burning.

At the Fire Station, #484 and 482 were already gone, so I took #487 and proceeded to the fire. Upon arrival, I found Tom Lucenay in charge. He did not have protective clothing but the fire was under control. It was a storage shed to the back of the 505 Angle Fire residence. I gave Tom my hat, coat, and shoes and he said Graff's two boys were missing. I then, called Jimmy Clark, our fire marshall to start a search for the boys and then went across the street and told Lt. Walkendorf of our concern for the boys. I went back to the location of the fire and was told by Tom that Webo Robertson fireman, had already discovered the boys in the remains of the storage shed. At this time Don Ford, fireman, told me to go back to the station and call for a Justice of Peace or a coronerto come to the scene. I took #487 back to the station, called Hewitt dispatcher and took drinks back to the firemen.

The following day I talked to Tom Lucenay and he told me of his concern about a gas can he had seen on the back porch. We also discussed other concerns. A door latch that was found with burn marks in the latched position. The position the bodies were in with wire or cable draped over the older one. I told him I would talk with Jimmy Clark again and have the film developed with copies to the police for further study of these concerns. This was done Wednesday August 27, 1986, the day following the fire and this ended my involvement.
