Intelligence Report (Information received on sale of vehicle owned by Henry Lee LUCAS)

SYNOPSIS

Information received reference the sale of a 1973 Oldsmobile Vista Cruiser by Henry Lee LUCAS in Del Rio, Texas.

DETAILS

1. Writer received information from Detective J. W. TERRY, Jacksonville, Florida S.O., that Ottis Elwood TOOLE, W/M, dob 03-05-47, 6'1", 200 lbs., brown/hazel, SS# 267-76-3365, stated Henry Lee LUCAS, W/M, dob 08-23-36, 5'9", 150 lbs., brown/brown, TDL# 11076084, sold a 1973 Oldsmobile Vista Cruiser Stationwagon that was cut down in the rear and made into a pickup type vehicle with Florida plates to a Mexican or Indian woman in Del Rio who sold ice cream on the streets in that city.
2. On 10-24-83, writer contacted Ranger Tol DAWSON and relayed the above information to Ranger DAWSON.
3. On 10-25-83, writer was contacted by Ranger DAWSON who stated he had located Rosaio HERNANDEZ, address 1209 North Main, Del Rio, who stated she had purchased the above vehicle during the first week in June of 1981.

4. HERNANDEZ stated she purchased the vehicle for forty dollars (\$40.00) and LUCAS gave her the papers and title on the vehicle.
5. HERNANDEZ stated there were other people who were with LUCAS at the time, one being another white male who was very thin, a white female approximately twenty years of age, who was also thin, and two children (a boy and girl, ages estimated by HERNANDEZ to be between eight and ten years of age that were also thin) and all being very dirty.
6. HERNANDEZ stated the above stayed in a park in Del Rio approximately five days after the sale of the vehicle.
7. HERNANDEZ stated LUCAS left all of the articles that belonged to him in the vehicle described by HERNANDEZ as a marijuana pipe, roach holders, lots of men, women and children's clothes, three women's purses, foreign coins among which were a French coin, Belgium coin, Columbia coin and a 1883 Indian Head penny, three or four high dollar car jacks, tire tools, two hamsters, two turkeys, one black imitation leather grained covered box (12" x 6" x 2" with "Frank" stenciled in the cover) and three or four pocket knives.
8. HERNANDEZ stated she had since taken the motor out of the vehicle and sold the vehicle to a subject by the name of Leonardo who then sold the vehicle to a Hispanic female, Maria RANGEL, who later sold the vehicle to a subject by the name of SURVANTEZ who then cut up the vehicle and sold it for scrap metal.
9. HERNANDEZ states the only things she has left from the vehicle sale are the above described coins.

Intelligence Report (recovery of weapons)

SYNOPSIS

Recovery of firearms sold by Ottis Elwood TOOLE, W/M, to Booker T. LEWIS.

DETAILS

1. On 10-06-83, Williamson County Sheriff Jim BOUTWELL and Deputy Ray HARDISON interviewed Ottis Elwood TOOLE, W/M, dob 03-05-47, 6'1", 200 lbs., brown/hazel, SS# 267-76-3365, in Jacksonville, Florida.
2. TOOLE stated to above officers that sometime TOOLE thought to be in June or July, 1982, he, TOOLE, sold two pistols, one a .22 caliber, the other a .25 caliber semi-automatic, to a black male taxi cab driver at the bus station in San Angelo, Texas.
3. On 10-17-83, writer contacted Ranger George FRASIER and requested Ranger FRASIER to attempt to locate the black male and recover the above firearms.
4. On 10-20-83, writer received two pistols from Ranger FRASIER, one a .22 caliber RG Model 14, SN# 271535. The other a .25 caliber semi-automatic Italian made Armi Galesi Brescia Brevetto, SN#326427.
5. Ranger FRASIER stated he recovered the weapons from Booker T. LEWIS, B/M, dob 05-21-

6. Ranger FRASIER stated LEWIS loaned an unknown white male seven dollars (\$7.00) on the two above weapons. The transaction had taken place at the bus station in San Angelo.
7. LEWIS claimed he saw the white male approximately one week later and the white male stated he would return for the weapons, however, he never returned.
8. The white male was described by LEWIS as being medium size, approximately 40 to 45 years of age, dark straight hair.
9. LEWIS stated the white male was accompanied by a white female described by LEWIS as 45 to 47 years of age, slender build, brown hair cut short, and medium height.
10. LEWIS stated the white male offered to sell LEWIS the .25 caliber semi-automatic for \$7.00 which the white female was carrying in a large bag with handles.
11. LEWIS refused the sale and the white male then removed the .22 caliber RG revolver from the white male's pants pocket and offered both guns for seven dollars.
12. LEWIS stated the white male stated he needed some money to send his wife back to Florida and LEWIS then loaned the white male seven dollars on the two pistols.
13. The white male stated to LEWIS he never liked to be without a gun when he hitch-hiked.
14. On 10-20-83, writer submitted the two above weapons to the Firearms Lab of the DPS to test fire the weapons for ballistics and compared against any unsolved homicides occurring in Texas where the above caliber weapons were used.
15. On 10-24-83, writer was contacted by Ranger FRASIER and received information that on 05-08-82, two subjects identifying themselves as Elwood TOOLE and Norvella TOOLE, giving address of 1139 Market Street, Jacksonville, Florida, received first aid at a hospital in San Angelo due to an automobile accident.
16. The accident was reported to have occurred between San Angelo and Big Spring in which a vehicle they were riding in collided with a truck.
17. Ranger FRASIER stated he had checked with the Highway Patrol, however, he had not been able to obtain any information in reference to the accident.
18. On 11-02-83, writer received ballistic reports from the above two weapons from the DPS Firearms Lab in Austin and writer initiated a nationwide teletype message

in reference to homicides involving these types of weapons.

19. The weapons ballistics are as follows:

The above .22 caliber RG has eight lands and grooves inclined to the right with land width dimension point .040-.043 and groove dimension .041-.045 per inch.

The .25 caliber semi-automatic had six lands and grooves inclined to the right with land width dimension of .040-.043 and groove width dimension of .083-.086 per inch.

20. Writer contacted ATF Agent Dale LITTLETON, Austin, and requested Agent LITTLETON to attempt to trace serial numbers of the above weapons through firearms registration files.
21. Writer received information from Agent LITTLETON on the .22 caliber RG that the weapon was sold on 06-01-71, to Rebecca HUDSON, W/F, dob 05-01-33, 5'5", 100 lbs., SS# 228-40-6558, address 1340 Morrsett Street, Jacksonville, Florida. The weapon being purchased from Ace Jewelry and Loan.
22. Writer contacted Detective J. W. TERRY, Jacksonville, Florida Sheriff's Office, and relayed this information to Detective TERRY for possible further investigation on the above weapon.
23. Writer received information from ATF Agent LITTLETON that a trace on the .25 caliber semi-automatic would have to be made starting at the factory in Italy since the weapon was sold prior to the U.S. requiring import names of firearms distributors being stamped on the weapons.
