they got home from school + Ed seemed to know exactly what shirts they had changed into. This is strange because he said that he was taking care of the baby in our room. How did he see them if after changing clothes they went straight out to play?

Joby + Jason had T. B. Skin Tests for school taken on Thursday, Aug. 21. The tests were suppose to be read on Monday, Aug. 25. I was attending In-Service Meetings + ran out of time to take them so I was going to take care of it Tuesday. Another weird incident because Ed is so precise about following through with anything + constantly reminds me of dates + detail information.

We usually keep our pantry stocked with at least 6 or more boxes of cereal. Over the week-end (the last time Ed went to the store) he only bought a couple of boxes - not like him.

Peggy (my sister) wanted to pick up the boys at Trinity Lutheran Daycare on Monday, Aug. 25 to take them to Richland Mall for Coca-Cola t-shirts. Ed was hateful, very rude, nervous + upset because Peg wanted to do this. He would not call daycare + give permission. Fortunately, I called Peg at lunch,

found out what was going on + I called to give permission for the boys to leave with Peg. He really let me have it when I got home. He seemed overly upset about such a minor incident. As a result of the boys leaving the daycare, we were asked to fill out some new forms (mainly because there's a new daycare director) with information to update the boys file. Ed made such a big deal out of the whole thing. It seems <sup>very</sup> strange that he would react so violently.

He always talk about supper or take something out of freezer the night before or that morning. Nothing had been done. So weird, now that I think about it.

Jason took Dinstapp A.M. + P.M. for allergies. Ed always refilled his prescription when the bottle was about half empty. Jason only had 2 or 3 pills left. I was going to get prescription refilled because I knew he was low but for some reason this time Ed never mentioned it at all.
