On 7-19-82, I contacted DAVID PEARCY, 772-1524 and he advised that he would be willing to undergo hypnosis in order to see if he could remember any additional information.

At 9:10P/7-21-82, DAVID PEARCY came to detective office where he was taken to the Chief's Office and did undergo a hypnosis section.

Prior to the hypnosis section, he signed a consent form and also a check list was filled out prior to the section.

During the section, the only information that MR. PEARCY could remember, was that he and his girlfriend, CANDYCE SAFTER WHITE, 772-1300, went to the park at approx. 9:30. He stated that they drove around by the boat ramp and then drove around to the curb to the right and parked facing the lake. He stated that he remembered seeing an orange Pinto parked to the right of them and a white large truck to the left of them.

He was unable to give any description on the Pinto, other than he remembered that it was orange and that there was no one in it.

In reference to the white truck parked to the left, he stated that all he could see was a passenger door & the left headlight and believed it to be a white truck with a chrome front bumper, having a bed on the rear with a silver grill and appeared to be an older truck, model and make unknown. He stated that it appeared to be some type of construction truck, with a sign on the passenger door, that had a white background and red letters. He stated that he believed that it had two words, one on top and one of the bottom; however, he had no idea as to what these words were and could not give any additional information on the truck. He could not describe rather it was a green truck, a dump truck or just a large P/U.

The information was given to DET. SALINAS, the consent form and the check list will be turned in to the records division, to be attached to this case.

CANDYCE SAFTERWHITE was contacted on 7-19-82 and agreed to come to the Police Department on 7-22-82 on Thursday at 1:P to undergo a hypnosis section to see if she could remember any additional information about the truck that she had seen a partial lic. #.
